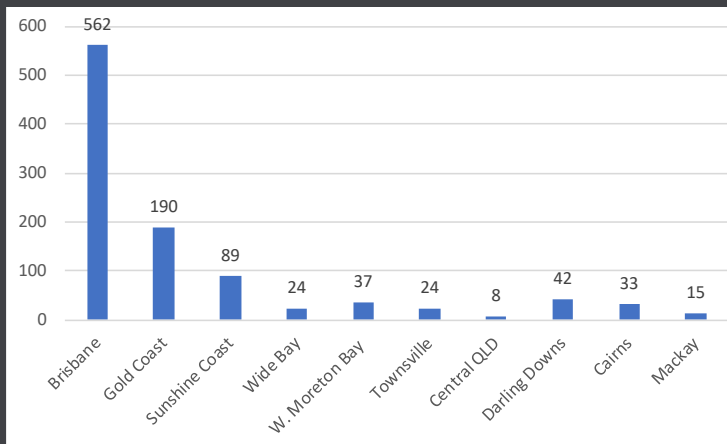

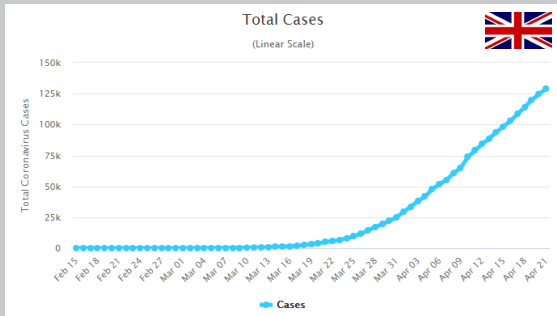
The UK Government's chief medical adviser has warned that restrictions on everyday life in the UK will need to be in place until a coronavirus vaccine can be developed.
