QLD COVID-19 update (26.04.2020, 0300 pm)

- Some stay-at-home restrictions for Queenslanders will be lifted on Friday this week ahead of the state's long weekend.
- Premier Annastacia Palaszczuk said people had done "a terrific job of flattening the curve" and small steps at easing restrictions could begin.
- From midnight on Friday, people will be able to leave their homes for recreational purposes like going for a drive, some non-essential shopping or having a family picnic with members of the same household.
- National Parks will also reopen but campgrounds will be closed.
- People will need to stay within 50km of their home and social distancing restrictions still apply.



What is 'growth factor' and why is it important?

there's one number that can tell us quickly whether the outbreak is getting better or worse. It's called the growth factor. If the growth factor is above one, the number of new cases each day is going up. If it stays above one consistently, alarm bells should be ringing. If it's below one, we're getting it under control. Australia's current growth factor is **0.8**
